

Nancy Toole to Jesse Clements. Ind^t.

This Indenture made &c; witnesseth, that Jacob Shoemaker and James Thompson trustees of the township of Thompson Patavia in the County of Geauga and State of Ohio, by and with the consent of James Thompson one of the Justices of the Peace of the said County and township, having put and placed and by these presents do put and place Nancy Toole a poor girl of the said township the 17th of April 1829, aged twelve years bound to Jesse Clements of Patavia, with him to dwell and from the day of the date of these presents until the said servant shall accomplish the full age of Eighteen years, according to the statute in that case made and provided, during all which time the said servant her said master faithfully shall serve on all lawful business, according to her power, wit, and ability; and shall honestly, orderly, and obediently in all things demean and

and behave herself, towards her said master and all his during the said term. And the said Tise Clement, for himself, his executors and administrators, doth, covenant and agree to and with the said trustees, and each of them, their and each of their heirs, executors and administrators and theirs and each of their ~~heirs~~ ^{successors} for the time being, by these presents that the said Tise Clements the said servant in the trade which she now useth shall and will instruct, or cause to be taught and instructed; and during all the term aforesaid, find provide and allow unto the said servant, competent and sufficient meat and drink and apparel, washing, lodging, ^{and washing} and all other things necessary and fit for a servant; and shall cause such servant to be taught or instructed to read write, and also shall and will so provide for the said servant, that she be not any way a charge to the township of Batavia, or inhabitants thereof, but of and from all charge shall save the said township harmless and indemnified during the said term and at the end of the said term, shall and will make, allow ^{provide} and deliver unto the said servant a new Bible, and at least two suits of common wearing apparel. N.B. and so much arithmetic as will include the single Rule of Three
